PANELISTS:

Dr. Heba Gowayed is an Associate Professor at the Department of Sociology at Hunter College and the Graduate Center. She is the author of an award-winning book *Refuge*, published with Princeton University Press, which explores how states shape the potential of people pursuing refuge within their borders. She is currently working on her second book, *The Cost of Borders*, which theorizes borders as a series of costly, and often deadly, transactions.

Dr. Jillian Schwedler is a professor of political science at Hunter College and the CUNY Graduate Center. She currently serves as a member of the editorial committee and previously chaired the board of directors (2002-09) of the Middle East Research and Information Project (MERIP), publishers of the quarterly *Middle East Report*. Dr. Schwedler has conducted extensive research in Jordan, Yemen, and Egypt, and she has traveled extensively throughout the Middle East. She is the acclaimed author of *Faith in Moderation: Islamist Parties in Jordan and Yemen* (Cambridge 2006) and, most recently, served as editor (with Laleh Khalili) of *Policing and Prisons in the Middle East* (Columbia/Hurst 2010).

Dr. Michael Lee is an Associate Professor at CUNY-Hunter College. His work explores financial crises, global economic governance, security, and the rise of populism. In addition to numerous articles his book *From Malaise to Meltdown: The International Origins of Financial Folly, 1844-* was published in 2020.
