PURPLE PEERIOD PROJECT



DR. FATEN TAKI

Dr. Taki was the Director of the omics core in the Human Rights Impact Lab at Weill Cornell Medicine. This role involved laying the groundwork for epigenomic and metagenomic research in extremely vulnerable populations such as refugees and asylum seekers in NYC. She also served as the interim director for the Anesthesiology Global Health initiative where she managed physicians in Global Health education and mentored resident physicians and medical students in global health research. Currently, she serves as the Chief of Bioinformatics Unit at the NYC Public Health Lab (PHL), Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. In her role, she will help drive the integration of microbial genomics with public health and manage all bioinformatics activities at PHL.

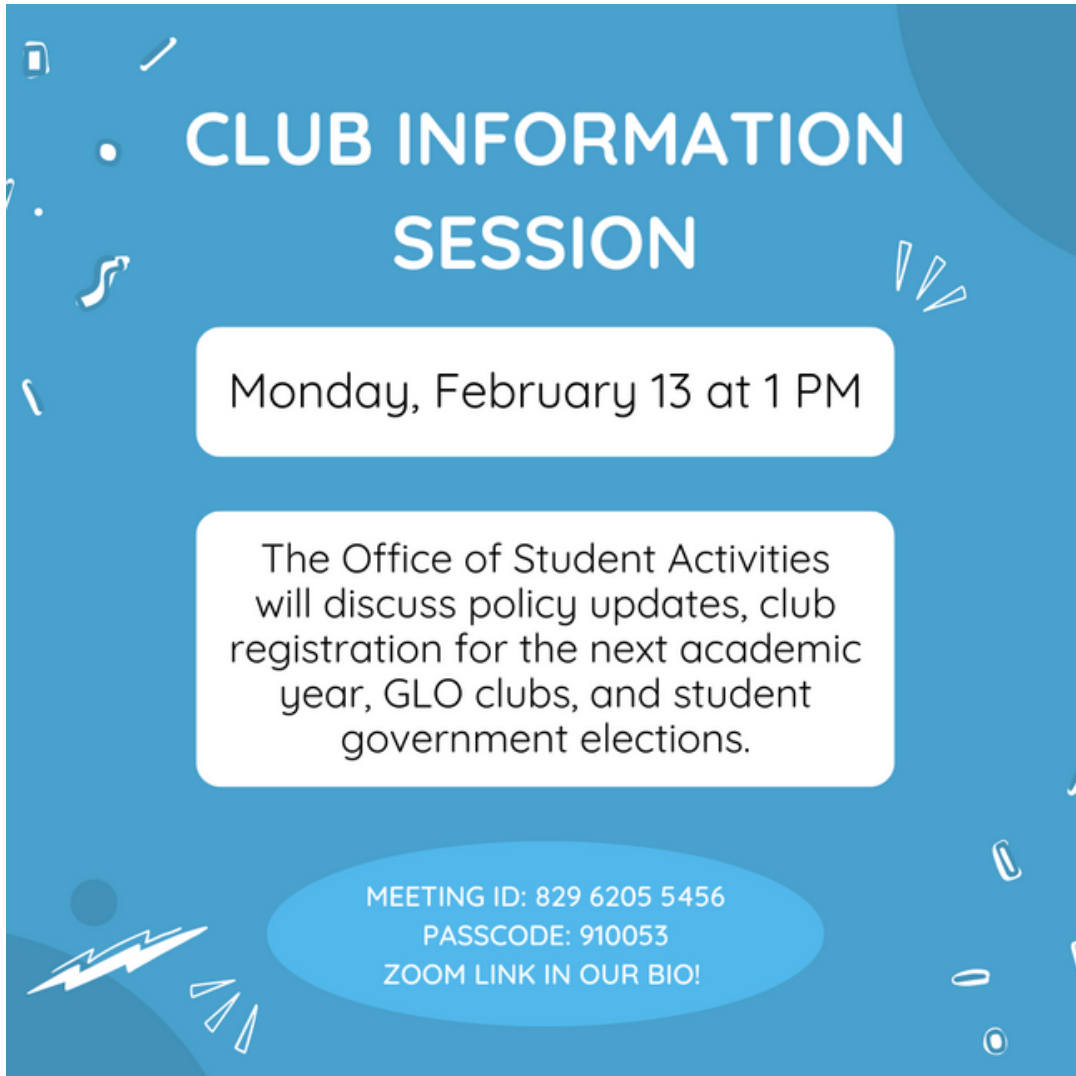
