SCREENING COMMUNICATION AND COGNITION OF INFANTS AND TODDLERS (SCCIT)

This infant/toddler screening lists the most common behavioral precursors to later speech, language, hearing and cognitive delays or disorders and can be used quickly as part of the parent/caregiver interview during well-baby visits.

Instructions: 3 or more alerts in a single SCCIT part or combined in both parts indicate a referral should be considered. Alerts leading to a referral can be accrued over several visits.

SCCIT Part A: infants through age 24 months may be considered for referral for 3 or more **YES** alerts, or, SCCIT Part B: infants through age 24 months may be considered for referral for 3 or more **NO** alerts, or, SCCIT Parts A & B: infants through age 24 months may be considered for 3 or more combined **YES** and **NO** alerts.
