Re: Health Benefits Changes and Announcements

I) Health Plan Rates Effective July 1, 2024

Basic coverage is available at no cost to the subscriber under certain plans, while other plans require a payroll deduction. Please review the deductions on your check in the first full payroll period in July to ensure that it matches with the July 2024 rate changes. Please be advised that these rates are subject to change. In the event of a rate change, your payroll deduction may either decrease or increase. II) Fall Transfer Period (November 2024)

This year, the annual transfer period will be held in November for active employees. During that period, employees can:

- Transfer to another health plan
- Add or drop an optional rider
- Add or drop dependents
- Change health premium contribution tax status
- Elect the Health Benefits Buy-Out Waiver Program Any changes made during the Fall Transfer Period will become effective on the first day of the first full payroll period in January 2025.

IV) Special Reminder to Medicare-Eligible Employees and Dependents (this does not apply to

over age 65 domestic partners of employees) Federal law requires the City of New York to offer employees over age 65 the same coverage under the same conditions as those that are offered to employees under age 65. The same stipulation also applies to dependents over age 65 and those covered by Medicare through the Special Provisions of the Social Security Act for the Disabled. In such cases, enrollment in a City health plan is primary coverage, and Medicare, if applicable, becomes secondary coverage. Make sure that you and your dependents, if enrolled in your coverage, inform all health care providers that your City health coverage is your and your dependent(s) primary coverage. If you and/or your

dependent(s) are Medicare-eligible and want Medicare to be your primary coverage, you must waive your City health coverage
