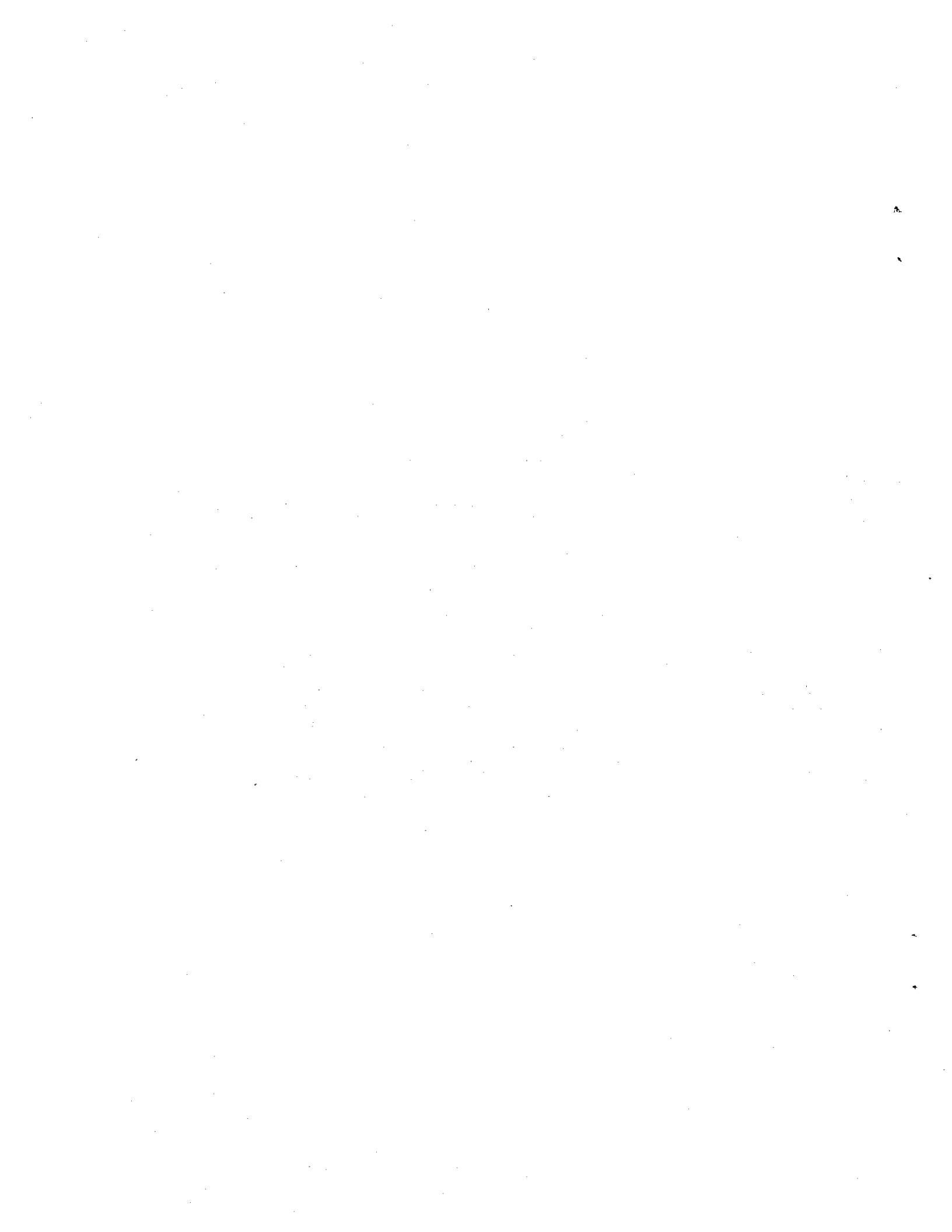
INTRODUCTION

UNIONIZATION AMONG COLLEGE FACULTY - 1981

Bifurcated union organizing, coupled with an uncertain legal environment may have accounted, in part, for the significantly reduced number of newly organized faculty bargaining units in 1981. Only two full-time faculty units elected bargaining agents, making this the lowest number of new certified units in the past decade. Furthermore, only eight "first-time" contracts were signed in 1981, which represented a substantial reduction in this category. These were at Johnson County Community College, KS; Delaware State College, DE; Hawkeye Institute, IA; Curry College, MA; Simon's Rock Early College, MA; North Orange Community College, CA; Cornell University School of Industrial and Labor Relations, NY (New York City campus), and the University of Nebraska, NE. The agreement in Nebraska was not a comprehensive one and included only economic terms and conditions. The North Orange agreement represented a structural change and contained two previously certified units at Cypress and Fullerton Colleges, which now bargain as one.

Despite the relatively few additions to the ranks of unionized campuses, the number of unionized college faculty is now at an all time high. As of January 1, 1982, NCSCBHEP statistics show 156,584 faculty under labor agreements with an additional 10,922 faculty belonging to duly certified bargaining units who have not negotiated labor agreements for a grand total of 167,506. With the expected election of a bargaining agent in the California State University (CSU) in 1982, and a projected slower-than-usual union growth rate, the number of unionized faculty in higher education will probably approach 200,000 by 1983.

Nearly all the organizing activity conducted by the three major agents, AAUP, AFT, and NEA occurred in California, where a bargaining agent election was held in December 1981, for the more than 19,000 faculty in CSU. Although the returns necessitated a run-off election, scheduled for April 1982, the results of the first

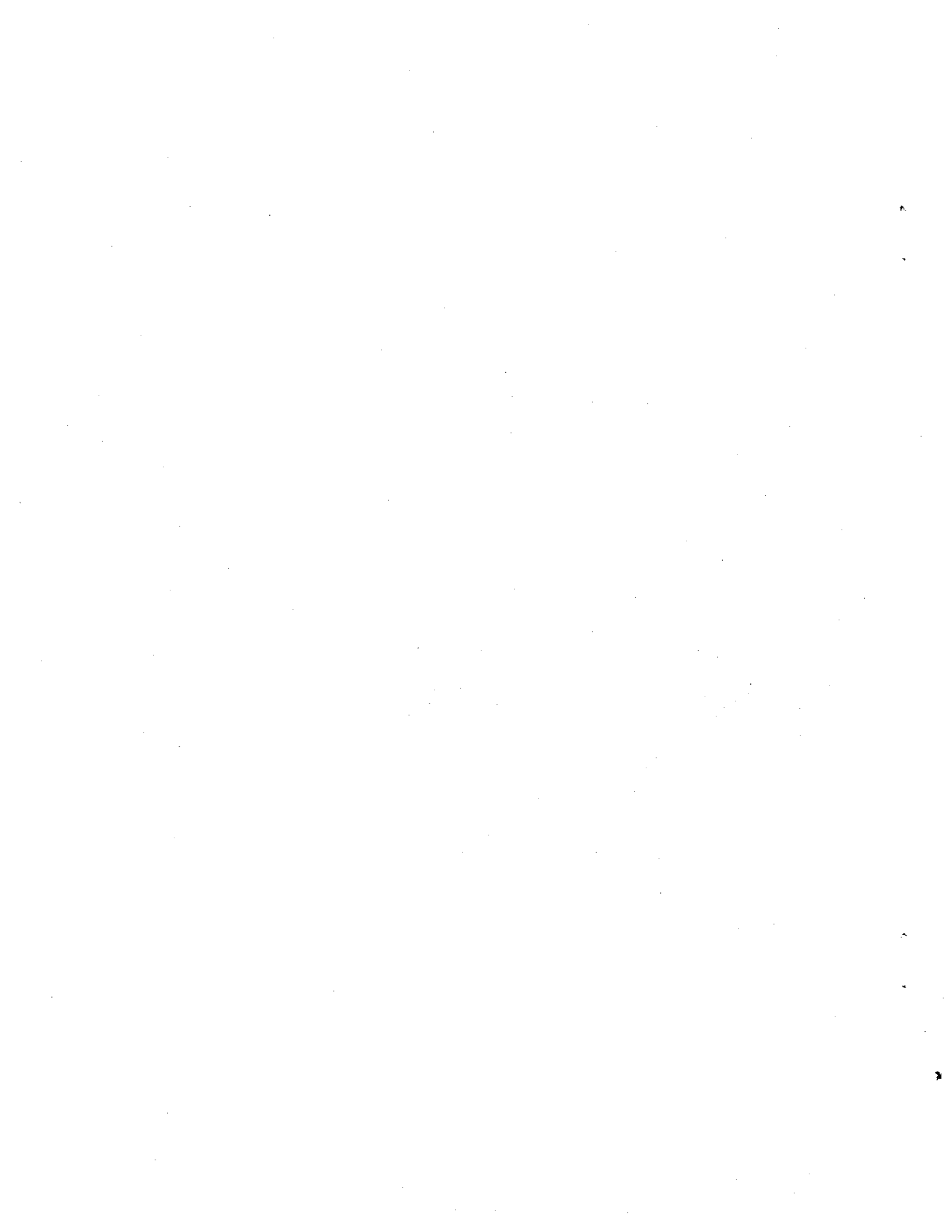


with the AAUP, while at the University of Pittsburgh the AAUP and the AFT explored a coalition arrangement for their forthcoming organizing drive.

Six strikes were reported at the outset of the 1981-82 academic year, two of which involved recognition stoppages by adjunct faculty seeking to either gain or strengthen their agent status. None of the "back-to-school" strikes identified could be directly linked to Yeshiva litigation; however, the stoppage at Wagner College in April did include Yeshiva issues. Adjunct strikes occurred at Cornell University School of Industrial and Labor Relations (New York City campus) and the Community College of Philadelphia System, while stoppages involving full-time faculty took place at Delaware County Community College, PA, Montgomery County Community College, PA, Dowling College, NY and the University of Dubuque, IA. The number of "back-to-school" strikes continues to decline from six in 1977, twelve in 1978, eleven in 1979 and eight in 1980.

Yeshiva-related litigation continued to play a dominant role in faculty collective bargaining. As of January 1, 1982, over forty private colleges and universities had exercised some type of Yeshiva-like claim. Additionally, two public universities, the University of Alaska and Wichita State University, sought extension of the Yeshiva doctrine to their institutions.

Post-Yeshiva employment relationships took a new format when local union chapters, who had either voluntarily or by administrative order lost their agent certification status, adopted "agreements" not based on either collective bargaining or traditional labor relations. These "agreements" were not labor contracts, nor were they based on the governing tenets of labor law, but instead were comprised of sections of former contracts, policy manuals, and faculty handbooks. In some instances, consent of the faculty senate is required prior to any change. Illustrative of this approach are the "agreements" at Drury College, MO, Daemen College, NY, and Mt. Vernon College, DC.



surveys, telephone interviews, and abstracting of all prior Directories. Every institution that had a reported agent with no contract was contacted for updating. The results yielded far fewer agents without contracts than had been reported in previous years. This should not be construed as an increase in collective bargaining activity but instead, in our judgment, represents a maturing of employment relationships. Furthermore, due to the relatively few organizing drives being conducted throughout the country, more time and staff were available to both faculty and administration to complete contract negotiations.

While the Directory, as always, has been a team project, the major portion of the day-to-day research and investigation was done by Steven Kramer, a research assistant with the Center. Steve's energy, tenacity and perserverance account for the thoroughness of the data. His knowledge of labor relations and all around trouble-shooting played a vital role in the successful completion of this project.

The statistical analysis, tabulation and graphic presentations were done by Alan Rosenberg, another research assistant with the Center. Alan's analytical skills and quantitative approach added another dimension to this endeavor.

As in the past, the technical aspects of the Directory were a result of the dedication and concern of Evan G. Mitchell and Ruby N. Hill. Their commitment to excellence, as well as their dedication to the Center, aided this project through its smooth and final conclusion.

Lastly, we offer special thanks to those many faculty leaders, union representatives, directors of personnel, administrative deans and others who took part in our surveys. Without them, this Directory would not manifest the accurate picture that it does. While we believe that the 1981 Directory is the most up-to-date and most comprehensive of its type; we apologize for any errors or omissions.

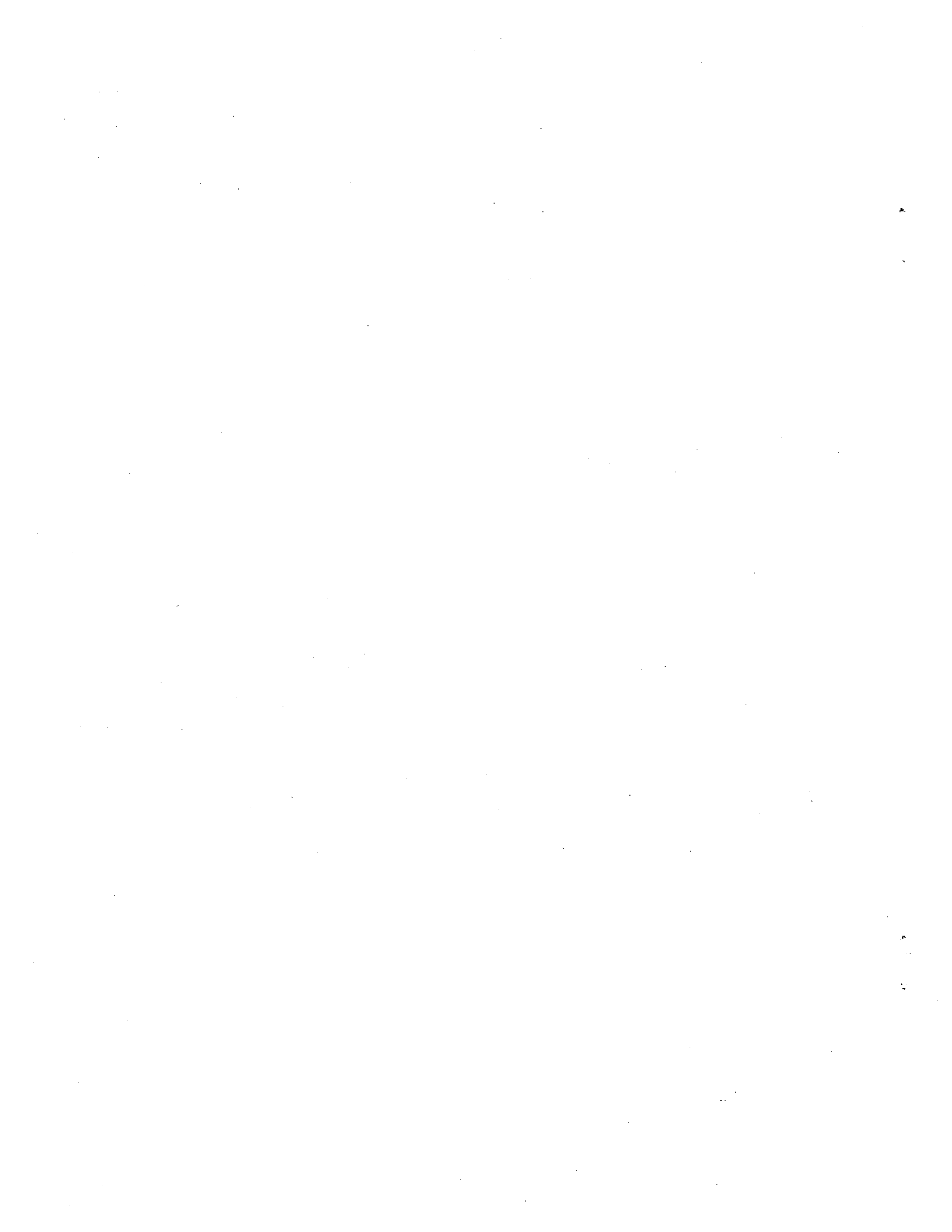

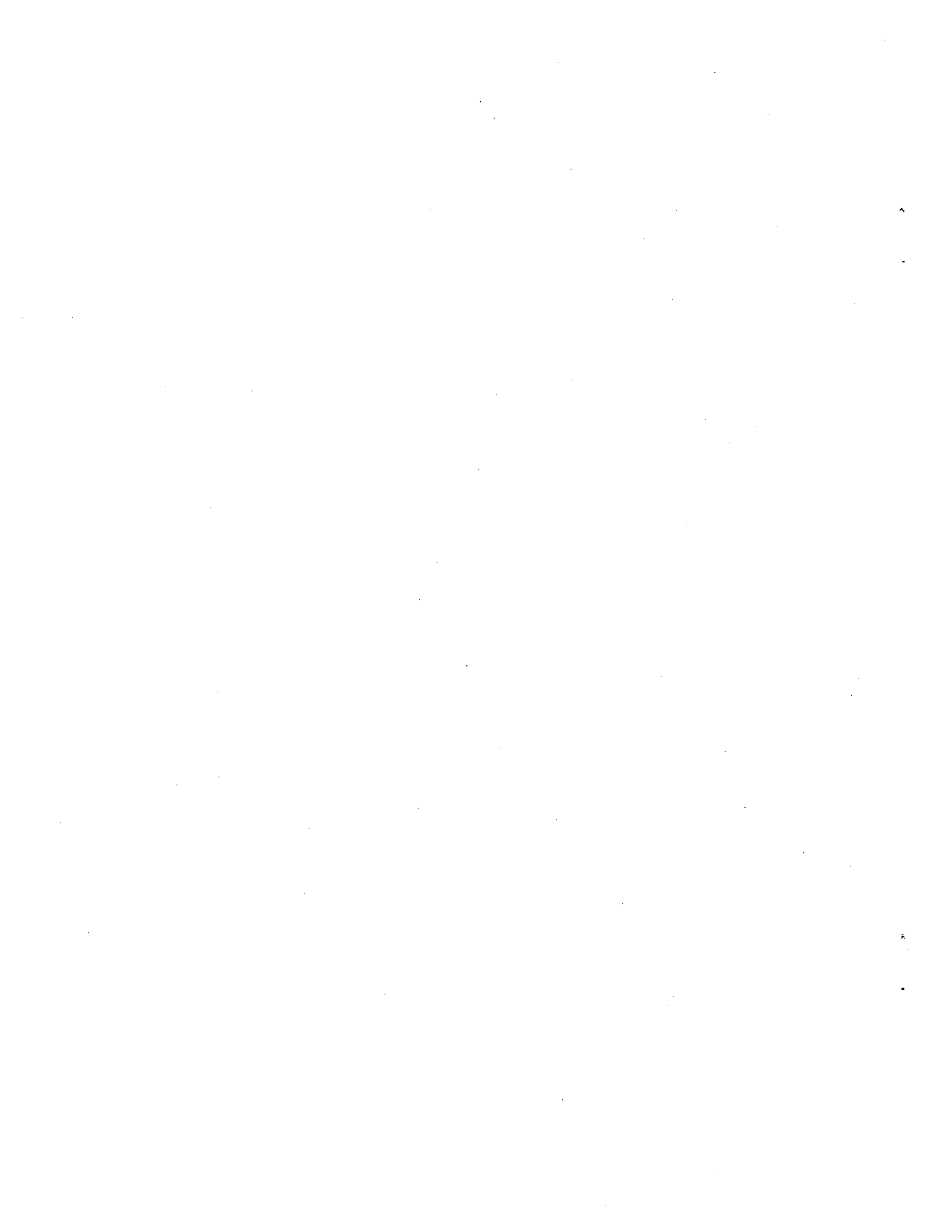

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTORS, 1974-1981

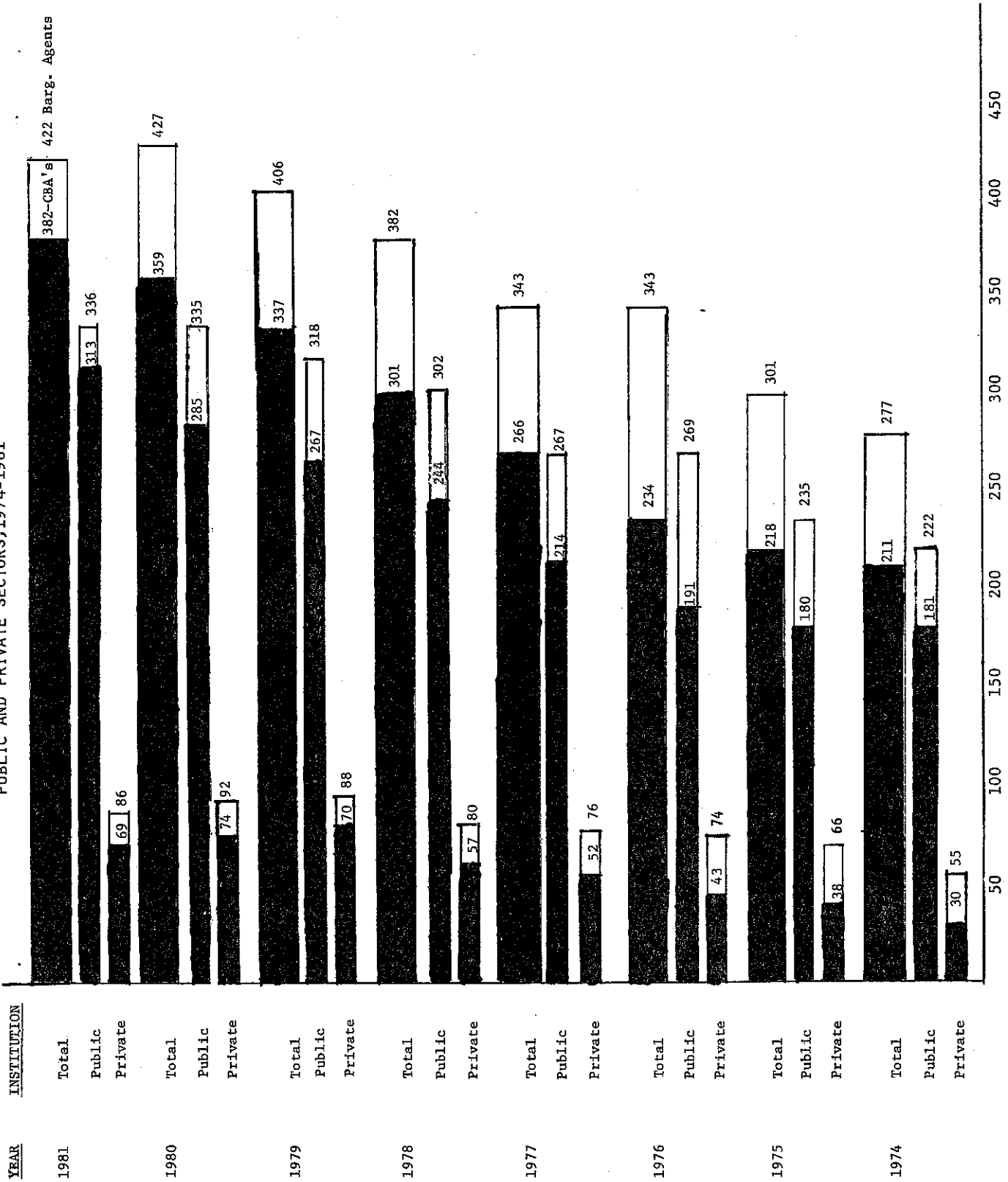


TABLE TWO

1974-1981

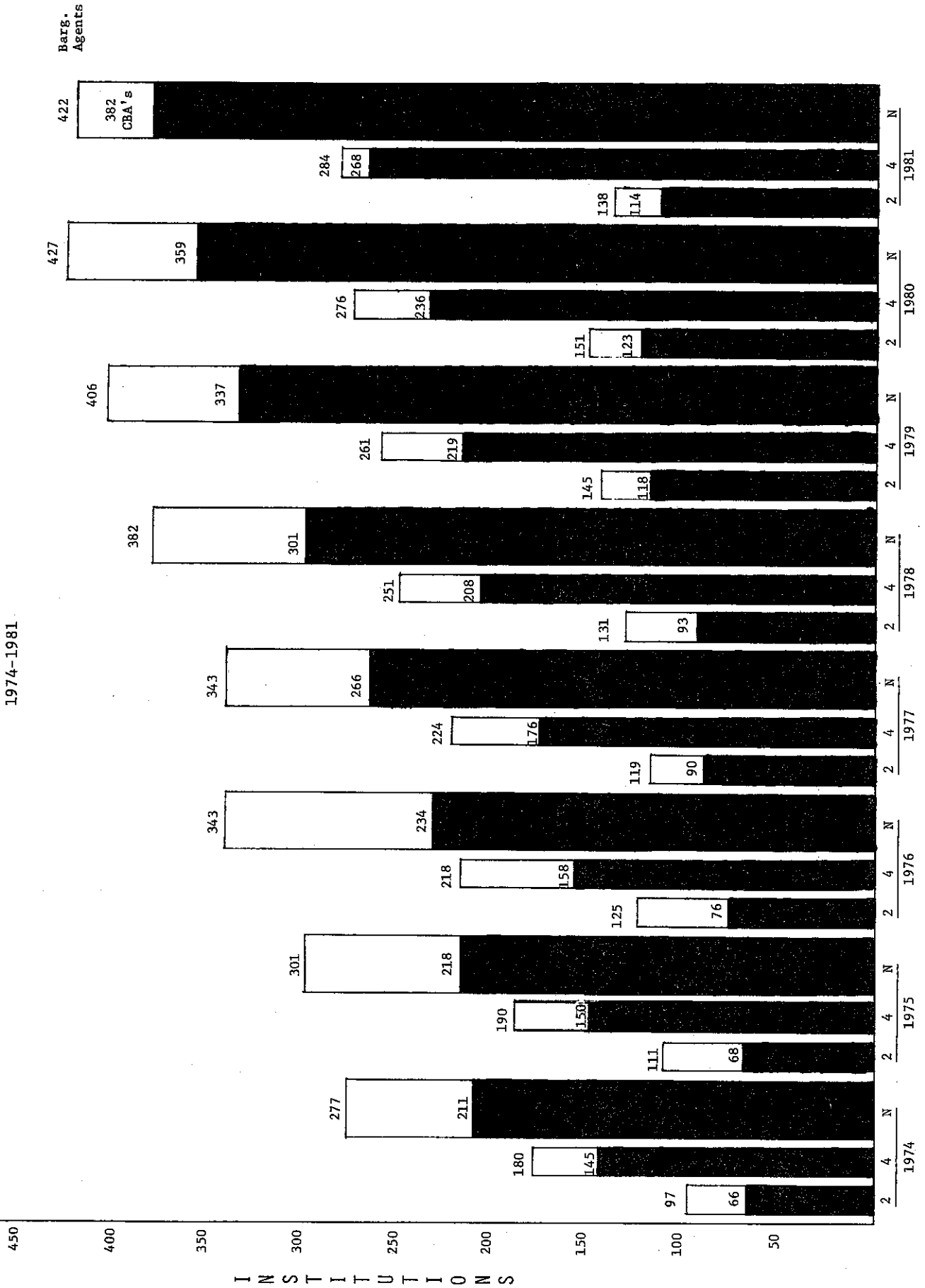
