



UNIONIZATION AMONG COLLEGE FACULTY

January 1, 1997 through December 31, 1998

INTRODUCTION

Unionization among college and university faculty continued its slow but steady increase in 1997. Academic unions now represent 256,084 professors, a growth of 5,368 (2.1 percent) from last year's *Directory*. We can now report 516 bargaining agents on 1125 campuses throughout the United States.

These increases can be attributed to the fact that unions have won several collective bargaining elections during the past year. Victories at Allen County Community College, Central Washington University, Highland Community College, Lake Tahoe Community College, Neosho County Community College, Oregon Coast Community College, Tech-Vocational Community College, University of Great Falls, University of Toledo, Bucks County Community College, Mercer County Community College, New Jersey State Colleges, Sussex County Community College, and the University of Alaska all contributed to growth in unionization among college and university faculty. Additionally, many bargaining units grew in size as institutions hired new faculty.

Public colleges and universities employ 244,801 unionized faculty members, with 1033 public sector campuses. Four-year public colleges and universities account for 128,783 of the unionized faculty members, with 99 bargaining agents on 342 campuses. Two-year public colleges have 116,018 unionized faculty members, with 348 bargaining agents on 691 campuses.

There are only 11,283 unionized faculty members in the nation's private colleges and universities, with 69 bargaining agents on 92 campuses. The overwhelming majority of these are employed at private four-year colleges and universities: 10,798, with 60 bargaining agents on 78 campuses. We can only report 485 faculty members on 14 two-year private sector campuses, represented by 9 bargaining agents.

Fourteen collective bargaining elections took place during 1997. Faculty members chose new collective bargaining agents in all of these elections.

AGENTS ELECTED

Faculty members voted for union representation at fourteen institutions during 1997. All of these elections wins occurred in public sector institutions, and include the full-time faculties of Allen County Community College, Central Washington University, Highland Community College, Lake Tahoe Community College, Neosho County Community College, Oregon Coast Community College, University of Great Falls , Bucks County Community College, and Tech-Vocational Community College. Finally, adjunct faculty at Mercer County Community College, New Jersey State Colleges, Sussex County Community College, and the University of Alaska also voted for union representation, as did non-tenure track lecturers at the University of Toledo.

CHANGE OF AGENT ELECTION

In 1997 there were no change of agent elections to report.

CHALLENGE OF AGENT ELECTION

There were no challenge of agent elections to report during 1997.

NO-AGENT ELECTION

There were no cases in 1997 of faculty voting for no-agent status.

AAUP

The AAUP participated in two of the fourteen elections held in 1997. At the University of Toledo the AAUP now represents 40 non-tenure track lecturers. In addition, the University of Alaska adjunct faculty voted 425-195 (in a unit of 1,030) in favor of the AAUP/AFT dual bargaining agent.

The AAUP and its affiliates, including dual affiliations, now represent 29,416 faculty in 62 bargaining units. These include 39 public and 23 private sector units. Of these, 52 are four-year and 10 are two-year institutions.

AFT

The AFT participated in nine of the fourteen elections held in 1997. At Bucks County Community College faculty voted 155-53 (in a unit of 450) in favor of the AFT. At Mercer County Community College in New Jersey, faculty voted 92-24 against no agent. Oregon Coast Community College faculty voted 22-10 (in a unit of 50) in favor of the AFT. The University of Great Falls faculty voted 20-19 (in a unit of 50). Adjunct faculty at New Jersey State Colleges voted 1114-90 (in a unit of 1,875) in favor of the AFT. The adjunct faculty at Sussex County Community College voted 61-24 (in a unit of

97) for the AFT against no agent. Part-time faculty at Tech-Vocational Community College voted 134-13 (in a unit of 197) for the AFT. At the University of Alaska adjunct faculty voted 425-195 (in a unit of 1,030) in favor of the AAUP/AFT dual bargaining agent. Central Washington University faculty voted 236-84 (in a unit of 320) in favor of the AFT/NEA dual bargaining agent.

The AFT and its affiliates, including dual affiliations, now represent 93,460 faculty in 167 bargaining units. These include 144 public and 23 private institutions. Of these, 53 are four-year and 114 are two-year institutions.

NEA

The NEA participated in five of the fourteen elections in 1997. Central Washington University faculty voted 236-84 (in a unit of 320) in favor of the AFT/NEA dual bargaining agent. Additionally, the NEA became the representative of faculty at Allen County Community College (unit size of 55), Highland Community College (unit size of 30), Lake Tahoe Community College (unit size of 21), and Neosho County Community College (unit size of 44) in 1997 although no data is available on vote counts is available.

The NEA and its affiliates, including dual affiliations, now represent 69,233 faculty in 235 bargaining units. These include 221 public and 14 private sector units. Of these, 37 are four-year and 198 are two-year institutions.

INDEPENDENT AGENTS

By the term independent agent, we mean any faculty bargaining agent which is not affiliated with another state or national union. There were no representation elections involving independent agents in 1997.

Independent agents no represent 15,275 faculty in 39 bargaining units. These include 32 and 7 private sector units. Of these, 10 are four-year and 29 are at two-year institutions.

DECERTIFICATIONS

The National Center knows of no bargaining agent decertifications which occurred during 1997.

STRIKES

No faculty strikes were reported for 1997.

LEGISLATION

The National Center cannot report any new state or federal legislation governing collective bargaining in higher education during 1997.

FIRST CONTRACTS SIGNED

Two new first contract were signed in 1997. At the University of Alaska, the dual bargaining agent AAUP/AFT signed a two- year agreement covering a unit of 700 faculty

at three campuses. Adjunct faculty at Middlesex County College, represented by AAUP, signed a three-year agreement covering a unit of 320 at two campuses.

DEMOGRAPHIC ANALYSIS

While this 1998 *Directory* shows collective bargaining agents in 32 states, Washington, DC, and Guam, faculty higher education bargaining remains geographical limited and almost exclusively a phenomenon of public sector institutions.

Two states, California (67,698) and New York (55,040) account for 122,738 or 47.9 percent of all unionized faculty members. The ten largest states for faculty collective bargaining (listed below) account for 229,219, or 89.5 percent of all unionized faculty members in the United States. Four of these ten largest (New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Massachusetts) are located in the northeast and are home states for 89,370 unionized professors, 34.9 percent of the total. The two west coast states, California (67,698) and Washington (10,892) represent another 78,590 faculty members, 30.7 percent of all unionized faculty. Put another way, seven states, four in the northeast and two on the west coast, account for 65.6 percent of the unionized professorate. Three states in the Midwest, Michigan (10,422), Minnesota (11,041), and Wisconsin (29,633) are listed among the ten largest states for faculty collective bargaining. Florida (10,163) is the only southern state to make the list.

Higher education collective bargaining is also largely limited to public sector institutions. Public sector colleges and universities employ 244,801, or 95.6 percent of the unionized professorate. Among public institutions, there is an even division between four-year and two-year colleges and universities. Four-year public institutions employ 128,783 faculty members, 52.6 percent of unionized faculty at all public institutions. Two-year public colleges employ 116,018 unionized professors, or 47.5 percent of all unionized professors at public institutions.



STATISTICAL ANALYSIS

"HOW WE COUNT"

We continue to receive queries as to the methods we employ to "count". Set forth below are several explanations as to our "counting" process which, we hope, will be of value to the reader.

INSTITUTIONS: Institutions are identified as colleges and universities that may be autonomous entities having a single campus (University of Montana), or as multi-campus systems (California State University) which bargain collectively as one. Each institution is represented by a single agent and is counted as one agent and/or one contract. The current volume of the Directory shows 509 agents in institutions involved in faculty collective bargaining. However, this figure embraces 1,097 campuses. In the example of SUNY, although there are 29 campuses, for the purposes of the Directory this is tabulated as one institution, one agent and 29 campuses.

CAMPUSES: To present another demographic perspective, we also have included a campus "count". A campus, as defined by the National Center for Education Statistics, has a permanent administration, offers programs at least two years in length, and is located in a community different from parent institutions so as not to be within commuting distance. Using SUNY once again, the 29 campuses include the State University Colleges at Buffalo, New Paltz and Potsdam, etc. All are covered by a single agreement. Our own college, Baruch, is one of the 18 campuses included in CUNY and, while reflected in the campus count, is subsumed under CUNY in the institution count.

TWO YEAR/FOUR YEAR: Those institutions that contain two- and four-year colleges within the same system, such as CUNY, are recorded as four-year institutions. However, the two-year components are tabulated as such under the campus count. For example, Queensborough Community College is shown as a unionized two-year campus, but its collective bargaining agreement status is tabulated as one of the 18 campuses under one institution, CUNY.

"WHO WE COUNT"

This Directory includes full- and part-time faculty, administrators, chairpersons, and other professional staff bargaining units. Professional staff is defined, but not limited to, librarians, counselors, computer specialists, registrars and related titles. It should be noted that at some institutions, librarians and counselors have faculty status, while at others, they are considered administrators. Excluded from the Directory are academic support staff (non-professional) and health care support staff. We acknowledge the existence of some overlap between groups and will make efforts to refine them in future volumes.

We have included a separate listing of graduate student unions, but we have not included those numbers in our statistics.
