COVID Protocols for In-Person Attendance:

The National Center is working with Hunter College and the Roosevelt House Public Policy Institute of Hunter College on safety protocols for in-person conference participation and will continue to monitor recommendations from the CDC and local health officials. Please see the NYC COVID-19 City-Wide Information Portal webpage.

All in-person participants at the 2023 Annual Conference, whether a presenter, attendee, staff, guest, or vendor will be required to be fully vaccinated. As part of conference registration for inperson conference participation your contact information will be submitted to Hunter College's Public Safety Office and that office will email you an unique <u>Cleared4 Access</u> link to submit your vaccination documentation to about (14) days before the event. It is <u>also</u> recommended that you bring your hard-copy vaccination documentation with you and ID to be presented as needed upon registration at the conference.

If you are not vaccinated, you must have proof of a negative PCR Test (not an antigen test) from the past (7) days from the last day of the event.

Regarding wearing masks, <u>NYC officials</u> suggest using a high-quality mask in all public indoor settings and around crowds at all times during the event except while <u>actively</u> eating/drinking, presenting, or in an outdoor venue where individuals can be physically distant. Masks must cover both the mouth and nose. We ask that participants honor the requests of others to mask up and/or maintain physical distancing.

If public health guidelines prevent the holding of an in-person event in March 2023, the National Center will announce a contingency plan.

Please use care when booking travel and hotel arrangements: the National Center is not responsible for airfare or other travel reimbursements should public health guidelines require cancellation of the in-person conference.
