The 2012 Directory of U.S. Faculty Contracts and Bargaining Agents in Institutions of Higher Education is a compilation of data and history of American academic union bargaining units.

Compiling academic bargaining units' data is akin to photographing an object in motion. Offered here is a snapshot that has frozen a moment in time. With the momentous contemporary changes in the collective bargaining environment, we caution our readers to be aware of the fluidity of the current situation with existing units under political stress in affected states and with organizing efforts underway to counteract this widespread pressure.

Since the last edition the legal structure for collective bargaining has dramatically altered with contingent faculty and graduate and post-graduate students organizing in increasingly significant numbers. Our data collections, and data presentation, acknowledge these developments.

We are including for the first time several comparative presentations of our data with those of the National Center for Education Statistics.

Authors' Notes: Data Gathering Process

Below is a description of the data gathering process, the sample and metrics we used to aggregate the information about faculty and graduate student employee (GSE) unions, bargaining units, collective bargaining agreements, and institutions presented in this *Directory*.

DATA SOURCES

The data on organized faculty and GSE units come from a variety of sources. Most of the data on bargaining units, including unit size, campuses covered, unit composition, and the year of the first collective bargaining contract, first contract ratification, and current contract expiration are self-reported through our survey instrument. Please see data definitions on pages xv-xvi.

This survey has identified 52 new faculty bargaining units and 4 new graduate student employee units.

A variety of methods were employed to gather both the contact information and data for each bargaining unit. From the spring-summer of 2008 through the spring-summer of 2011, we updated current contact information for union and institution representatives for both the units that were listed in the 2006 *Directory* and for new units (identified by using lists provided to us from the national offices of the AAUP, AFT and NEA as well as from union press releases and news searches). We merged all the updated and new information into our database; in most cases, an institutional contact (i.e. a Human Resources Officer) and a union contact were identified for each bargaining unit.

Also in the spring of 2008, we developed a unit-level instrument "survey" (see Appendix C) that we used to query our contacts for each bargaining unit. In the summer of 2008, the contacts were either mailed or e-mailed the survey by the Center. Two email follow-ups were sent to units that did not respond. Phone contact was established with some non-respondents and with institutions where surveys were incomplete. We received 353 responses; 1,252 database contacts were e-mailed or mailed.

Throughout the summers of 2009-2011 data gaps were bridged with internet searches (many institutions and/or collective bargaining units now post their collective bargaining contracts online) and with the assistance of officers and staff of the national and state union affiliates of many of the bargaining units.

Sometimes institutional data differed from data provided by a local union. In these cases we averaged the figures.

RESEARCH UNIVERSE

This publication includes only bargaining units that enjoy full recognition from both the institutions of higher education with which they bargain and the state public employee relations boards that govern the relationship. It does not cover *meet and confer* relationships in higher education institutions. There remain some gray areas such as units that may have recognition from a labor board but are being contested by the employer or units where, due to recent restrictive changes in the collective bargaining law, the recognized union chooses not to seek formal certification but to deal informally with the employer. In cases such as these we have been inclusive by incorporating these units into the *Directory* and by indicating variances from traditional collective bargaining relationships in Notes.

The *Directory* includes full- and part-time tenure track faculty, full- and part-time non-tenure track faculty, non-instructional faculty, instructional staff, and chairpersons, when they are included in faculty bargaining units or have their own units. Non-instructional staff are only included when they are in bargaining units with faculty. All non-instructional faculty (NIF), instructional staff (IS), and non-instructional staff (NIS) were counted as full-time tenured and tenure track (FT-TTT) unless otherwise noted. Units requiring explanations have notes located in Table 2 Notes.

We recognize that there is, therefore, overlapping of part-time non-tenure, non-instructional faculty and staff into the FT-TTT category resulting in some possible over counting.

We have made the best categorizations we could using definitions based on available data from surveys, online research of units, and information provided by the national unions.

HOW WE COUNT

We describe the distribution of faculty and GSE union representation using four different metrics. The advantage of examining the data using various metrics is that it allows for a more comprehensive understanding of the distribution of faculty/GSE unionization. The data are described using the following metrics:

- Number of Institutions Covered: The number of institutions or systems of higher education (hereafter referred to simply as institutions) with faculty or GSEs covered by collective bargaining contracts. Institutions that are composed of multiple campuses are only counted once.
- Number of Campuses Covered: The number of component campuses within the
 institutions that have faculty or GSEs covered by collective bargaining contracts. A campus,
 as defined by the National Center for Education Statistics, has a permanent administration,
 offers programs at least two years in length, and is located in a community different from
 parent institutions so as not to be within commuting distance.

Please take special note of the following three bullet points before reading further.

Bargaining Unit: a bargaining unit is defined as a group of employees (faculty and/or GSEs) with their own collective bargaining agreement. In the American higher education sector all bargaining units are contained within an institution, but an institution may contain several bargaining units that differ in several dimensions including faculty status (i.e. full-time or part-time, tenure or non-tenure track) or campuses covered by the collective bargaining agreement.

The 2012 *Directory* covers 639 bargaining units. Full and current data (unit size, full-time, part-time, tenure or non-tenure track status) are available for 444 units from 1,252 individual contacts that yielded 353 completed surveys. The discrepancy between the number of units (444) and the number of surveys (353) is explained by multiple units covered by different collective bargaining agreements at the same institution.

Data for 61 units are not current though complete regarding categories (unit size, full-time, part-time, tenure or non-tenure track status). This data was provided by the national unions

which could not provide current data and by data from the 1998 and 2006 Directories (when this was our only recourse).

Data for 134 units are not current and does not categorize full-time, part-time, tenure or non-tenure track status. Here we relied on 1998 and 2006 data that did not have corresponding categories to those in the current edition of the *Directory*. The data for 134 units creates a cohort of **uncategorized faculty (see below)**.


- Uncategorized Faculty: 134 bargaining units did not return a survey: their total gathered by unit size is 53,116 (see Tables 10a 11b in the columns marked uncategorized faculty). The full-time, part-time, tenure or non-tenure track status of the uncategorized faculty is *unknown*. The total of 53,116 is derived from the unit size totals of the 1998 or 2006 *Directory* data and recent updates from the AFT, NEA, and AAUP. The uncategorized faculty is counted by unit size to determine the totals for the following: institution type, control (2-year, 4-year), geography, and national union affiliation.
- Represented Faculty and (some) Professional Staff: Throughout the 2012 *Directory* the total number of employees covered by collective bargaining agreements ranges between 315,357 and 368,473 due to the fact that we could only count the unit size for the uncategorized faculty and not their FT/PT, TTT/NTT status (see Tables 10a 11b). We have accepted institutional definitions for full-time and part-time. In the Summary of Findings on faculty unionization (Charts 1 2a) the percentages are based on a comparison of our counts (386,473 and 315,357 respectively) with the totals reported by the National Center for Education Statistics of the U.S. Department of Education (NCES). These data and categories are not completely congruent and are presented as approximations. In the remaining section on faculty unionization the analyses are based on the NCSCBHEP data only.
- **Graduate Student Employees**: The total number of employees covered by the collective bargaining agreement at the time of the report, which is subject to change in short periods of time due to the rapidly changing number of GSEs covered by collective bargaining agreements. In the Summary of Findings on GSE unionization (Chart 7) the percentages are based on a comparison of our count with the totals reported by the NCES.


Summary of Findings

This snapshot reveals that 432,897 faculty and graduate student employees (GSEs) are represented by unions in the United States: 368,473 faculty and (some) professional staff and 64,424 GSEs¹. Below are the summaries and analyses of our findings about the percentages of organized academic workers compared to the total cohort of academic workers as reported by the NCES; distribution of these organized academic workers is also displayed by institution type and control, tenure track and non-tenure track status, geographic region, and particular union affiliation. The growth in both faculty and graduate student employee unionization since the last publication of the *Directory* in 2006 is also charted and analyzed.

FACULTY UNIONIZATION

Twenty-seven percent (27%) of *all* faculty counted by the NCES is unionized (see Chart 1).² Forty-two percent (42%) of *all* faculty at public 2-year colleges is unionized and twenty-five percent (25%) of *all* faculty is unionized at public 4-year institutions (see Chart 1a below).³





The GSE total of 64,424 includes the 3,131 members at the Univ. of Wisconsin-Madison who chose not to recertify in the summer of 2011 under the newly passed and much more restrictive collective bargaining law in Wisconsin.

In order to simplify these snapshots Charts 1a and 2a do not illustrate private 2-year institutions, public 2/4-year institutions, private for-profit, or institutions that offer less than two 2-year programs. But in both of these charts the totals are represented (for further reference, see Appendix A).

¹Because professional staff members are sometimes included in faculty bargaining units, they are included in the 368,473 total.

³This higher percentage at public 2-year institutions partly reflects the historical linkage of community colleges to K-12 school districts, where unionization has been the norm for decades. The lowest percentages are for faculty in private 4-year institutions, due partially to the Yeshiva Decision of the United State Supreme Court (NLRB v. Yeshiva Univ. - 444 U.S. 672 (1980)). The *Yeshiva* decision defined private sector FT-TTT faculty with some shared governance responsibilities as managers and ineligible for collective bargaining under the National Labor Relations Act (though it did not forbid it). This decision has not been applied to NTT faculty, either PT or FT, or to faculty where there is no tenure system, such as the for-profit sector, where there are no shared governance systems.




Chart 1a: Public 2-Year Institutions Have the Highest Percentage of Organized CBA Faculty

When analyzed by full-time status, the percentages of all unionized *full-time* faculty counted by the NCES coincide with the categories and figures in Charts 1 and 1a (for further reference, see Appendix A).

When analyzed by part-time status, twenty-one percent (21%) of all *part-time* faculty counted by the NCES is unionized (see Chart 2). Twenty-eight percent (28%) of unionized *part-time* faculty is at public 2-year colleges and twenty-one percent (21%) of unionized *part-time* faculty is at public 4-year institutions (see Chart 2a).




Chart 2: Just Over a Fifth of Part-Time Faculty Is Organized




Chart 2a: Public 2-Year Institutions Have the Highest Percentage of Organized Part-Time CBA Faculty

In the United States 368,473 faculty members including uncategorized faculty are represented by a recognized collective bargaining agent. These organized faculty members are broken into 639 separate bargaining units and are distributed across 519 institutions or systems of higher education with 1,174 campuses (Table 8). These faculty members are heavily concentrated in public institutions. Less than (7%) seven percent are employed by private colleges or universities and less than (1%) one percent is employed by private for-profit institutions. At private colleges, this difference is largely driven by the employee status of FT-TTT private university faculty under the National Labor Relations Act. The current precedent, Yeshiva, is a hurdle to organizing in the private non-profit sector, particularly of potential units that include faculty with significant sharedgovernance responsibilities. Among organized private school faculty (99.9%) work in 4-year institutions; only 251 organized faculty members in the United States (0.1% of total) are employed at private 2-year institutions (Table 9b).

Organized faculty is more evenly divided across institution type (2-year or 4-year institutions). Specifically, 43.4% of organized faculty is employed at 2-year institutions relative to 32.7% at 4-year institutions; the other 17.4% is located in public systems that have both 2-year and 4-year components.4

An alternative way to analyze the distribution of organized faculty in the United States is to disaggregate the data by employment level of the represented faculty - full-time or part-time (Tables 10a and 10b). For the institutions for which data are available on employment level and institution type, 53% of organized faculty in the United States is employed on a full-time basis.⁵

Further parsing the data by institution type and control (Chart 3 below), differences emerge with respect to tenure or non-tenure track status. Organized faculty at public 4-year institutions is the most likely to be employed FT-TTT (54.9%) while faculty at private 4-year institutions (28.4%) is the least likely to enjoy similar status. Overall, 48% of represented faculty and professional staff are employed with tenure-track status.

The number of organized faculty has increased significantly since 2006, the last year the *Directory* was published. The current number of organized faculty members exceeds the 2006 figure by over 49,969, a 14% increase. Growth in the number of organized faculty can be attributed to three factors: (1) growth *within* the bargaining units that existed in 2006, (2) growth due to the formation of *new bargaining units* after 2006 (or from late 2006-2011), and (3) units that were missed in the 2006 count. The majority of the increased number of organized faculty is in the growth of pre-2006 units with roughly 29,000 new members; for new units formed after 2006 and for units that were missed in the 2006 count approximately 20,900 members compose these categories. These figures, for the most part, do not reflect the significant cutbacks since 2008 that are increasingly being felt in public institutions due to the economic crisis. In many institutions faculty numbers are dropping for FT-TTT and in some for PT-NTT as well. Neither do these figures reflect the recent legal and political struggles that have resulted in much more restrictive legislation for faculty public sector bargaining in some states. On the other hand, we do not yet know the full impact of the seemingly somewhat more



favorable NLRB attitude toward private sector academic collective bargaining reflected in some recent decisions.

Looking at the organized faculty geographically, organized faculty members in the United States are distributed across 31 states and the District of Columbia with the bulk of union faculty located in the West, Mid-Atlantic and Midwest regions (Table 8). In fact, a majority of unionized faculty is concentrated in three states: California, New York and New Jersey, and nearly two-thirds counting Illinois and Michigan. The states with the largest number of organized faculty are the following:





Of the organized faculty, 53.5% is represented, in whole or part, by one of the three national unions that have historically represented academic workers -- the American Association of University Professors (AAUP)⁸, the American Federation of Teachers (AFT), and the National Education Association (NEA). Including joint affiliations, the AFT/NEA and AFT/NEA/AAUP compose another 25.5%; with the NEA/SEIU/AAUP and AFT/AAUP comprising smaller percentages of the total. The roughly 43,000 unionized faculties that are not represented by the AAUP, AFT or NEA are represented by a mix of other unions. 7.2% of these unionized faculty belong to unions that have no national affiliation (independent unions), while the rest are affiliated with other national unions, including the United Auto Workers (UAW), the Communication Workers of America (CWA), the Service Employees International Union (SEIU), and the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME).

Other trends emerge by examining the distribution of faculty represented by the national affiliates on two institutional dimensions – institution type (2-year or 4-year) and control (public or private). The AFT and NEA exhibit similar patterns with respect to both these dimensions (see chart on next page). The AFT and NEA represent more faculty at 2-year institutions than 4-year colleges and universities, with the NEA's 2-year proportion slightly higher than that of the AFT. Also, the AFT and NEA almost exclusively represent faculty at public institutions. The AFT and NEA proportions of represented faculty employed at private institutions are 11% and 13.7%, respectively. The joint

affiliation of the AFT/NEA evens out the representation between the organizations at both public and private institutions, as well as between the 2-year and 4-year public institutions. Likewise, the joint NEA/SEIU/AAUP bargaining agent significantly raises each of these unions' organized portions in the public 4-year sector.

The AAUP units differ significantly from those of the AFT and NEA. The AAUP's faculty membership is mostly centered on 4-year institutions; 78.7% is employed at 4-year institutions, which are double or more than double the respective percentages for the AFT and NEA. Second, the AAUP is also distinctive in that 26.8% of AAUP-represented faculty is employed at private institutions, a substantially larger proportion than either the AFT or the NEA. The jointly affiliated AAUP units with the AFT and AFT/NEA compose a solid portion of the public sector 4-year and 2/4-year institutions.

Independent unions – those without national union affiliation – follow patterns similar to the AFT and NEA with respect to institution type and control. Lastly, other national affiliates such as CWA, SEIU, and UAW show interesting splits between 2-year and 4-year public institutions and the private sectors; while the AFGE affiliate only represents one 4-year public institution and AFSCME only represents 2-year and 4-year public institutions.

GRADUATE STUDENT EMPLOYEE UNIONIZATION

Twenty percent (20%) of all graduate student employees (GSEs) counted by the NCES are unionized (see Chart 6). At public 4-year universities a quarter of GSEs are unionized (for further reference, see Appendix A).




Chart 6: A Fifth of All GSEs Are Organized


Today, 64,424⁹ GSEs in the United States are represented by recognized collective bargaining agents. These organized GSEs are distributed among 28 institutions or systems of higher education, all in the public sector (Table 12).

Graduate employee unionization has become much more substantial since 1990. However, its history reaches back to 1964 at the University of CA, Berkeley, when the first written contract was signed between the university and a GSE union (AFT in this case) which won representation rights not through a labor board election, but through direct action at the same time as and in conjunction with the Free Speech Movement. That unit and CBA did not survive without protective legislation, which only came into being in CA during the 1980s, (though those GSE's are now represented by UAW) but a few other units of that era did succeed (University of Michigan, University of Wisconsin, University of Oregon, for example); all AFT affiliated at major public research universities.

While unionized GSEs can be found in fourteen states across the country, a majority of organized GSEs are concentrated in three states: California (31% of total), Florida (14% of total), and New York (8% of total); all other states are represented below.



GSEs are represented by a variety of unions, which also represent faculty units except for the United Electrical Workers (UE) (Chart 8 and Table 13). While there is overlap between the unions that represent faculty and GSEs, the relative representation differs significantly. The AAUP, AFT and NEA represent 54% of organized faculty in the United States (Table 6) but only 29% of GSEs. While industrial unions have a significant presence among organized GSEs with the UAW representing 43% of all organized GSEs, the AFT alone represents 26% and the joint affiliation of the AFT/NEA holds 15%. All other totals are cited below.

It is important to note that the industrial unions' GSE membership is concentrated in large units while the traditional academic unions represent more, but smaller, units spread across more institutions.

In the 30 years since the initial GSE union was formed, another 12 units were organized and survived; today, these pre-1994 units represent over 33% of the total number of organized GSEs (see Chart 9).

As depicted in the table above, since 2006 GSE unionization has advanced, but more slowly than previously. However, the number of GSEs organized in the past 16 years is about twice the number organized in the previous 30 years (1964-1994). In the last 16 years, not only have 18 GSE units been added, but the units, on average, are larger than the previously organized units. The University of California, California State University system and the University of Washington are prime examples of this phenomenon.

The pace of new unit organization has slowed since 2005, due partially to the changing legal environment for unionization of GSEs. In many states with faculty bargaining laws GSEs were excluded or the law was interpreted by the employers as excluding them as students rather than employees eligible for representation. This has resulted in extended legal battles in many states, often at the same time that organizing efforts were continuing. This legal un-clarity remains in some states. Additionally, since 2010 a number of states are debating or have revised their existing collective bargaining laws with consequences that are not yet fully clear. In response some existing unions are considering not seeking certification under the new laws, such as in Wisconsin where the Madison Teaching Assistants' Association/AFT voted in the summer of 2011 to not seek recertification but rather pursue a direct but informal relationship with their employer, the University of Wisconsin, without recourse to the law or the labor board.

In the private sector, changing NLRB and US Supreme Court decisions have given GSEs bargaining rights and then taken them away. This has resulted in one loss of representation and CBA (New York University). This is presently an area of active litigation, while, as in the public sector, organizing efforts continue on a number of private campuses.

Another growing cohort that will need to be tracked in the future is post-doctoral units. This edition of the *Directory* did not include a question in the survey instrument for these units. Currently, Rutgers University has a separate post-doctorate unit with an indeterminate number of members; the AAUP was recognized as the bargaining agent in 2009; as of 2011 the unit was bargaining its first contract.

Definition of Terms

2/4-Year Institution: The highest degree that the institution confers: either at the associate (2) or the baccalaureate (4) level; graduate degrees are not considered in this categorization, though faculty teaching graduate courses are counted if union-represented. Some institutions (systems) include both 2-year and 4-year campuses.

Bargaining Agent (BA): An organization, a labor union in this context, which is designated by an appropriate government agency and/or recognized by the employer as the exclusive representative of all employees in the bargaining unit for purposes of collective bargaining. In Tables 2 and 3, the bargaining agent(s) are listed by the local, state affiliation(s) if the survey respondent listed it, and national affiliation(s). Please see Table 1 for a list of the union acronyms and their full names.

Bargaining Unit (BU): A group of workers who bargain collectively with their employer, an institution of higher education. The unit may include all the workers of a single institution or only a portion of the employees of an institution. The final unit is determined by the National Labor Relations Board, a state-level public employee labor board, or otherwise agreed to jointly by the union and the employer. In the higher education context, an institution or system may have more than one bargaining unit (BU) with which it shares a collective bargaining relationship. If multiple bargaining units of faculty or graduate student employees (GSEs) exist at a particular institution or system, they are enumerated separately in Tables 2 and 3.

Campus No.: The number of campuses covered by the collective bargaining contract. This may differ from the total number of an institution's component campuses since the faculty or GSEs at some, but not all, component campuses may be covered by the contract.

Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA): A contract between an institutional employer and a bargaining agent on behalf of a bargaining unit.

Faculty Bargaining Unit Composition: The categories of employees included in the bargaining unit. Employees with varying titles are included in bargaining units. In order to simplify, however, the following seven employee categories along with the BUs percentage of tenure/non-tenure and historical information are broken out in Table 2 and the Faculty Dataset:

Full-Time Tenured and Tenure Track (FT-TTT): Faculty employed on a full-time basis who have tenure or the prospect of tenure.

Part-Time Tenured and Tenure Track (PT-TTT): Faculty employed on a part-time basis who have tenure or the prospect of tenure.

The following five summary categories of faculty and staff below do not break out the great variety of employment statuses that exist for contingent non-tenure track faculty and instructional staff.

Full-Time Non-Tenured or Tenure Track (FT-NTT): Faculty employed on a full-time basis who do not have tenure or the prospect of tenure.

Part-Time Non-Tenured or Tenure Track (PT-NTT): Faculty employed on a part-time basis who do not have tenure or the prospect of tenure.

Non-Instructional Faculty: Librarians, counselors and other non-instructional faculty who may be in the faculty bargaining unit.

Instructional Staff: Staff without faculty status but who are in faculty bargaining units and do instructional work.

Non-Instructional Staff: Staff without faculty status who do non-instructional work, but are in BUs with faculty.

It is important to note that if a bargaining unit contains members of an employee category, not all members of that employee category need be in the unit. In the case of NTT faculty, especially PT, many BUs only include a minority portion of the total, which may be based upon % load, years of service, consecutive service, or other factors.

(%TTT): The percent of the bargaining unit that is employed with tenure or the prospect of it.

(%NTT): The percent of the bargaining unit that is employed without tenure or the prospect of it.

Current Agent Elected: The year in which the current bargaining agent was elected or otherwise recognized as the representative of the bargaining unit.

Initial Agent Elected: The year the first bargaining agent was elected or otherwise recognized as the representative of the bargaining unit. This may differ from the year that the current agent was elected because the bargaining agent may have changed once or more since the initial agent was recognized. In Table 2, this information is provided if the following two conditions are met: (1) the initial agent was elected in a year different from the current agent and (2) we know this information from previous editions of the *Directory* or from surveys or contacts that provided that information (we did not include a question that addressed these initial bargaining agents in the most recent survey, but explain to the best of our knowledge the full history of units that have more than one agent in Table 2 Notes).

Initial CBA Ratified: The year the members of the bargaining unit first ratified a collective bargaining agreement (CBA).

Current CBA Expires: The year the current collective bargaining agreement expires.

Graduate Student Employees Bargaining Unit Composition: The following four employee categories along with the BUs historical information are broken out in Table 3:

Teaching Assistants (TAs): Graduate student employees whose primary duties are to teach their own courses, course sections or otherwise aide in instruction.

Research Assistants (RAs): Graduate student employees whose primary duties are to conduct research.

Graduate Assistants (GAs): Graduate student employees whose primary duties vary according to the needs of their employer.

Other GSE: Graduate student employees (GSE) with all other titles including grader and tutor.

Institution: The name of the employing higher education institution or system. Only institutions with legally recognized collective bargaining agents were included; institutions that only have 'meet and confer' relationships are not included, though some in possible transition were included.

Union: The term used for both the local bargaining agent organization for a defined bargaining unit (group) of workers and also the national and/or state affiliate of a local bargaining union.

Unit Size: The total number of employees covered by the collective bargaining agreement, regardless of union membership. If more than one respondent provided information for a unit and the unit size number differed, an average was taken. Because of changes in BU size during data gathering, these numbers may vary from current reality.





2-Year Public Institutions Have the Higher Percentage of Organized Full-Time CBA Faculty*



Appendix D: Errata Sheet - Corrections to the 2006 Directory

By Geography:

- CA Allan Hancock College has an Independent unit of FT Faculty that was not accounted for in 2006, nor was the school listed as having union representation on multiple campuses.
- CA Antelope Valley College bargaining unit includes 350 non-instructional staff members that were not counted in 2006.
- CA City College of San Francisco has an Independent unit of department heads that was not accounted for in 2006; the bargaining agent for the faculty unit of the City College of San Francisco was incorrectly listed as AFT/NEA/CFT/CTA; the agent is the Local 2121/CFT/AFT.
- CA Feather River Community College has PT-NTT faculty in their unit; in 2006, this cohort was not listed.
- CA San Francisco Art Institute, in 2006 noted the AAUP as the elected bargaining agent in 1996, older editions of the *Directory* noted an Independent agent beginning in 1996; the correct history is the AAUP having been elected in 1984.
- CA Santa Clarita CC has a FT unit of 177 members, the NEA was recognized as the bargaining agent in 1977; this unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- CA State Center C.C. District has 2 units; one FT-TTT and one PT-NTT; in 2006 these units were listed as one unit.
- CA The California Faculty Association (CFA) is a local but state-wide affiliate for the bargaining unit in the California State University system; the 2006 *Directory* incorrectly excluded the CFA, which has multiple affiliations.
- CT In 2006 Post University was included in the *Directory* with that name, but in 2004 the institution's name changed from Teikyo Post University to Post University; the 2006 *Directory* did not note the name change.
- CT Saint Joseph College has a FT-TTT unit of 96 members, the year the AAUP was recognized as the bargaining agent is unknown; this unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- IA In 2006, at the University of Northern Iowa the number of people in the bargaining unit was noted as having 868 people in the unit; the correct number is 750.
- IL In 2006 for Unit 1 at the Chicago City Colleges the total number of faculty members was 4,235 as provided by the survey respondent at that time; the correct number is 700.
- IL College of DuPage: agent history -- Independent in 1984; NEA in 1989.
- IL Prairie State College PT-NTT faculty organized a unit in 2006; it did not make the 2006 Directory.
- IL Roosevelt University is a private institution but was not noted as such in 2006.
- IL Southeastern Illinois College: the historical information for the bargaining unit was switched around; 1984 was the year the current agent was recognized; 1985 was the year the initial CBA was ratified.
- IL Bargaining agent for the William Rainey Harper College PT-NTT unit is the IEA/NEA; in the 2006 *Directory* the IFT/AFT was incorrectly listed as the agent; and 2004-2005 were incorrectly listed as the year(s) of the bargaining agent being elected, the correct year is 1994.
- KS Coffeyville C.C.: agent history -- NEA in 1980; Independent in 1982.
- KS Flint Hills Technical College has a FT unit of 27 members, the NEA was recognized as the bargaining agent in 2003; this unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- KS Fort Hays State University is a 2/4-year university; it was noted as a 2-year university in the 2006 *Directory*.
- KS the history of the bargaining agent at Highland C.C. was corrected to: the NEA in 1997 and Independent in 2005. The 2006 version had 1984 as the year of the first contract being ratified, but there is not any agent elected on record until 1997. The year the first contract was ratified with the NEA as the agent is unknown, thus, the year 2005 is used and was reported in the most recent round of surveys.
- KS Manhattan Area Technical College has a FT unit of 27 members, the NEA was recognized as the bargaining agent in 2003; this unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- MA Massachusetts C.C. System's unit 1 was recorded in 2006 as having a PT-NTT cohort; only unit 2 contains the PT-NTT faculty.

- MA Quincy C.C. has a FT unit of 65 members, the year the NEA was recognized as the bargaining agent is unknown; this unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- MA University of Massachusetts, in 2001 Unit 1 at the Amherst and Boston Campuses absorbed PT-NTT members from a second adult ed unit at the Boston Campus; the 2006 *Directory* did not note this merge.
- MA University of Massachusetts, Lowell's PT unit's initial CBA was ratified in 2012.
- MA Wentworth Institute of Technology is a private institution but was not noted as such in 2006.
- MD The National Labor College has a FT unit of 20 members, the Newspaper Guild/CWA was recognized as the bargaining agent in 2003. This unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- ME The Maine C.C. System has an adjunct unit of 800 members; the SEIU was recognized as the bargaining agent in 2010.
- MI In 2006 Michigan Technical University–Houghton was noted as having organized a faculty union in 2004; the correct year was 2001. That unit decertified in 2008.
- MI At Monroe County C.C. the 2006 *Directory* having 1969 as the date for the first contract being ratified was incorrect. The earliest date on file for the unit is 1968 as an independent union; 1968 is the date to be used going forward for the ratification of the first collective bargaining agreement.
- MI At Mott C.C. the 2006 *Directory* stated 1994 as the year the current agent was recognized. From the earliest versions of the *Directory* the year of the union being recognized and the first contract being ratified were both 1996. In 1997, 1994 was inserted for the year of the current agent being recognized, but this was either a misprint or having to do with the PT faculty being brought into the unit. However, there isn't any historical mention of that in the 1997 *Directory*.
- MI At the University of Detroit Mercy the history of the bargaining agent is the AAUP/NEA in 1975 and the NEA in 1990; this was not noted in the 2006 edition of the *Directory*. The University of Detroit and Mercy College merged in 1990 in which an election was held and the NEA won bargaining rights.
- MI At Western Michigan University the 2006 *Directory* noted a multi-campus collective bargaining agreement; the university does not have campuses, only regional sites.
- MO Jefferson College has a FT/PT unit of 389 members, the NEA was recognized as the bargaining agent in 1983; this unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- NH C.C. system of New Hampshire has a FT faculty, academic and operations staff unit of 1,150 members, the SEIU was recognized as the bargaining agent in 1973, this unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- NH Plymouth State University has a PT-NTT unit of an indeterminate number of members, the SEIU was recognized as the bargaining agent in late 2011, the unit was only included in Table 2 of the 2012 *Directory*.
- NJ Ocean County College has a PT-NTT unit of 454 members, the Independent bargaining agent was elected in 1982; this unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- NJ In 2006, the New Jersey Institute of Technology completed a survey, but the data was mistakenly omitted. The unit size in 2006 was 698.
- NJ In 2006 at Rutgers University, the AFT was not noted as the joint bargaining agent with the AAUP for the 3 units (including the GSEs) at the university.
- NJ In 2006, Union County College was listed as a private institution; it is a public 2-year institution.
- NY Cornell University–NY State School of Industrial and Labor Relations' unit is composed of part-time non-tenure track faculty rather than part-time permanent faculty as listed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- NY Culinary Institute of America has a FT unit of 117 members, the year the AFT/NEA was recognized as the bargaining agent is unknown; this unit was listed as Independent in 2006 *Directory*.
- NY The Fashion Institute of New York includes PT-NTT faculty which were not noted in 2006.
- NY Finger Lakes C.C. has a PT unit of 222 members, the year the AFT/NEA was recognized as the bargaining agent is unknown; this unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- NY Rider College was listed on Table 2, no such institution exists. Rider University was listed on the Dataset, seemingly as a duplicate of Rider University in New Jersey. Rider University in New Jersey is the correct institution.

- NY Saint John's University has a faculty union with two branches: 1) AAUP and 2) the Faculty Association, due to the historical development of the union there. The 2006 *Directory* recognized these branches as the AAUP/Independent, for the purpose of computing the current *Directory* only counts this unit as being affiliated with the AAUP.
- NY In 2006 at Suffolk County C.C. numbers for an independent unit 2 composed only of administrators was published. The 2012 *Directory* does not include this unit.
- OH Kent State University: Agent history -- AAUP/NEA in 1975, AAUP in 1979.
- OH North Central State College has a FT unit with an indeterminate number of members, the AAUP was recognized as the bargaining agent in 2006; this unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- OH Terra C.C.: Agent history -- NEA in 1985, AFT in 1992.
- OR Umpqua C.C. has a FT unit of 64 members, the NEA was recognized as the bargaining agent in 2006; this unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- PA Art Institute of Philadelphia, a private for-profit institution has a unit of approximately 211 members with an 105 FT and 106 PT members; AFSCME was recognized as the bargaining agent in 1986. This unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory* and the 2012 *Directory*. The total for this unit, however, is illustrated in Chart 1a of the 2012 *Directory*.
- PA Montgomery County C.C.: Agent history -- AAUP in 1979, AFT in 1982.
- PA The Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education has two units: 1) faculty and 2) instructional staff (made up of 340 coaches, APSCUF was recognized as the bargaining agent in 2000). Unit 2 was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- RI Roger Williams University is a private institution but was not noted as such in 2006.
- SD Mitchell Technical Institute has a FT unit of 63 members, the year the NEA was recognized as the bargaining agent is unknown; the unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- SD Western Dakota Technical College has a FT unit of 52 members, the year the NEA was recognized as the bargaining agent is unknown; the unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- WA Cornish College of the Arts is a private institution but was not noted as such in 2006.
- WA Evergreen State College has a FT/PT unit of 270 members, the NEA was recognized as the bargaining agent in 2006; the unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- WA At Lower Columbia College the 2006 Directory did not include the PT-NTT category in the total number of people in the unit.
- WA Western Washington University has a FT/PT unit of 770 members, the NEA was recognized as the bargaining agent in 2006; the unit was missed in the 2006 *Directory*.
- WI Lakeshore Technical College does not have FT tenured faculty; they only have FT instructional staff members.
- WI Milwaukee Area Technical College has two faculty units; the 2006 *Directory* only noted one unit, but this did not affect the total number of the members.

By Union Representation:

1. The 2006 *Directory* mistakenly quoted Independent unions as being 73% of the total faculty represented; it should have been listed as 7.2%.
