### APPENDIX II

Non- Degree Testing

Fall 1990

## Overview

In response to the resolution of the Senate requiring CUNY Skills Assessment Tests and the Hunter Placement Test of all non-degree students, preparation was made by a variety of offices and testing for  $\underline{\text{new}}$  non-degree students began on June 24, 1990.

Of the 1,472 new non-degree students accepted for Fall 1990, 550 (37.3%) took the CUNY Skills Assessment Tests and the Hunter Placement Test prior to the beginning of the Fall 1990 semester.

The costs of the new testing procedures are presented in Tables I and II. Costs to Student Services are based upon an anticipated 60 percent show rate for the first testing date and a 35 percent show rate for all subsequent test dates.
