	In the case of a search for Associate Provost, the Hunter College Senate shall elect a panel of 6 students; 8 faculty in such a manner as to achieve the widest possible distribution among the divisions; and 4 members of the staff* (with titles of faculty rank and of HEA, HEO, Registrar, and persons on the Executive Compensation Plan) from other units of the College (e.g., Administration, Student Services, Library, Writing Center, Academic Computing, Math Learning Center, Registrar's Office, Admissions, Audio Visual). It shall be the responsibility of the Vice President for Administration to convene a meeting of the staff* who fall into this category for the purpose of nominating at least 4 candidates from which the Senate will choose 4 nominees.
