



28 April 1993**

<b>Report by the Administrative Committee:</b>	<u>Approved Curriculum Changes</u> The following curriculum changes, as listed in the Report dated 28 April 1993, had been approved as per Senate resolution, and were submitted for the Senate's information: Items GR-364 (Special Education), UR-857 (Music), US-837 (School of Nursing), US-840 (Energy Policy Studies), US-839 (Economics).	7 8 9 10 11
	<u>Continuation of UARC Report re: CR/NC Grading System</u> The motion on the floor was the following motion to amend the first sentence of the second to the last paragraph on the left of page 2 of the Report:	12 13 14
	"The Credit/No Credit system may be elected by students up until the time, within College regulations, that the student completes all course work/exams."	15 16 17
	Voting by hand produced the following results: 28 in favor and 6 opposed.	18
	A recount was ordered.	19
	The motion was approved by hand vote with 36 in favor, 9 opposed, and 8 abstentions.	20 21
	Professor Gilpatrick moved that the report be amended by adding the following sentence to the second to the last paragraph on the left of page 2 of the Report, which would then read:	22 23 24
	"...a form obtained from the Registrar's Office. <u>The form is a contract between the student and the instructor. It includes the option that the student may specify the lowest letter grade that would be acceptable to the student before a credit/no credit decision is made, and instructs the teacher to calculate the student's letter grade and enter that grade or a credit/no credit grade based on the student's specification.</u> " When departmental policies allow...	25 26 27 28 29 30 31

	Voting by hand produced the following results: 30 in favor, 22 opposed, 4 abstentions.	33 34
	A recount was ordered.	35
	The required number of 33 votes not having been achieved, the motion carried over to the next meeting.	36 37
	Professor Bennick moved that the report be amended by deleting the following sentence from the second to the last paragraph on the left of page 2 of the Report:	38 39 40
	"Students requesting grading according to this system must satisfy whatever attendance requirement has been set by the instructor, complete all assignments, and take the final examination; otherwise, the grades of WU and INC shall apply."	41 42 43 44

After discussion, Dr. Rothschild moved that Professor Bennick's amendment be amended as follows:	45 46
"that the first part of the sentence be retained, and that only the phrase 'otherwise, the grades of WU and INC shall apply' be deleted."	47 48
After discussion the question on Dr. Rothschild's amendment was called and carried.	49 50
The motion carried by hand vote with 35 in favor, 9 opposed, and 10 abstentions.	51
The question on Professor Bennick's amendment, as amended, was called and carried.	52 53
The amendment, as amended, was approved by hand vote with 38 in favor, 5 opposed, and 6 abstentions, and became part of the main motion on the floor.	56 57

<b><u>UARC Report re: Clarification of Catalogue Wording</u></b>	59
Professor Sherrill presented the Undergraduate Academic Requirements Committee Report dated 28 April 1993 as submitted. The motion on the floor was the motion that the sentences on pages 9 and 25—listed below— of the current Undergraduate catalogue be replaced with the following new wording:	60 61 62 63
"Baccalaureate, master's, or doctoral degree holders (from a college or university accredited by a regional U.S. accrediting association) and senior citizens are exempt from testing."	64 65 66
<u>Page 9 (current wording):</u> "Baccalaureate degree holders from regionally accredited U.S. institutions and senior citizens are exempt from testing, provided proof is submitted along with their application."	67 68 69
<u>Page 25 (current wording):</u> "Students holding a baccalaureate degree from a college or university accredited by a regional accrediting association and senior citizens with non-degree status do not have to take the proficiency examinations."	70 71 72
After discussion, Professor Clarkson moved that the motion be recommitted.	73
The motion to recommit was defeated by hand vote.	74
After discussion, Dean Kalb moved that the motion be amended by:	75
(a) <u>changing the sentence on page 9 to read:</u> "Baccalaureate, master's, or doctoral degree holders (from a college or university accredited by a regional U.S. accrediting association) and senior citizens are exempt from testing, provided proof is submitted along with their application."	76 77 78 79
(b) <u>changing the sentence on page 25 to read:</u> " Baccalaureate, master's, or doctoral degree holders (from a college or university accredited by a regional U.S. accrediting association) and senior citizens with non-degree status do not have to take proficiency examinations."	80 81 82 83 84
After discussion the question on Mr. Kalb's motion to amend was called and carried.	85 86
