Reports:	Report by the Ombuds Officer Professor Giuseppe Di Scipio, Hunter College Ombuds Officer, presented the following report:	44 45 46
	He said: "From January 1993 to September 1993, the Ombuds Office handled one hundred and sixteen cases. Approximately 20% of those cases required several meetings and went on for an extensive period of time. The majority of complaints or requests for assistance came from students (circa 90%), 7% from faculty and 3% from staff.	47 48 49 50 51
	Students requested assistance mostly for grade dissatisfaction, racist or homophobic practices, conflicts with professors, financial aid, and miscellaneous problems with the various departments or offices, including the Registrar's Office, Bookstore, Medical Office, Business Office, etc. Faculty and Staff requested assistance because of alleged unfair practices by their superiors, as well as racist and homophobic practices.	52 53 54 55 56 57
	Most faculty members and departments are very cooperative. Some departments are the favorite target of students or some students are the favored targets of some departments. I am not going to identify any, but of some of them I myself am weary. At times one senses rigidity, bureaucratic stubbornness and lack of sympathy.	58 59 60 61 62
	I urge the Hunter College community to respond to students' needs with a greater sense of awareness and of fairness. Their task is not an easy one given the present harsh social conditions. I sense from the many complaints that some faculty members should reach out more.	63 64 65 66
