APPENDIX II

President Jacqueline Wexler addressed the Senate and expressed unequivocal support for the Chancellor's mobilization effort for the restoration of the CUNY Budget for 1977-78. Letters from the Chancellor to the faculty were available and in the process of distribution.

Mrs. Wexler stated that, in addition to the support requested for the mobilization, there is the question of a presentation to the Wessel Commission—and on this point, there are different views and approaches to the available alternatives. The President of the four older senior colleges agree that the alternative that is agreed upon must include the future of those four institutions in some kind of consortium with the University Graduate Center.

President Wexler then discussed Volume I, number 1, of <u>Open Line</u>, a factual presentation of available information, which will be published as a report from the President and/or from the Provost when there are issues that are important to communicate to the entire community. The first issue included budget information and enrollment projections and invited anyone in the community to request clarification of any issues under consideration.

A number of persons, including the student newspapers, requested a clarification of "page 4" which dealt with the adherence of the College to the Chancellor's guidelines for Budget allocations.

In the Chancellor's Memo, "Column 6" is the total of instructional costs per FTE. "Column 6," which, in our budget figures, is \$18,126,000 (compound to \$18,221,000 in the Chancellor's guidelines), is made up of the actual direct instructional cost plus the non-instructional costs for academic administration, clerical assistance and lab technicians. Those are the ingredients of the amounts included on page 4 of Open Line. The Chancellor's use of the word "instructor" includes direct instructional costs and all academic administration costs.

In her responses to questions from the body, Mrs. Wexler continued to clarify these points, quoting directly from the Chancellor's Guidelines of June 30, 1976.
