	The motion to amend (lines 30-34 above) carried by hand vote with 40 in favor, 21 opposed, and 12 abstentions.	39 40
	Prof. Sherrill moved that the Select Committee postpone activities until the slate is filled by the two additional voting members.	41

The main motion as amended was on the floor. 46 The question was called and carried. 47 The main motion, as follows, was approved by hand vote with 56 in 48 favor, 2 opposed, and 13 abstentions: 49 Select Committee on the Distribution Requirement 50 Chairperson: Prof. Allan Brick (English) 51 Faculty Members: Prof. Hans Spiegel (Urban Affairs) 52 Prof. Elizabeth Beaujour (Classics) 53 Prof. Beverly Sowande (Academic Skills) 54 Prof. Carlos Hortas (Romance Languages) 55 Prof. Ezra Shahn (Biological Sciences) 56 Prof. Phyllis Campbell (School of Nursing) 57 Student Members: Ms. Karen Bell (Special Honors Curriculum) 58 Ms. Miriam Pedrayas (Communications-SGS) 59 Ms. Mary Lou Chiarella (Classics) 60 1 Graduate Student 61 1 At-large Student 62 Ex-Officio: Chairperson, Undergraduate Course of Study Com-63 mittee 64 The "Select Committee on the Distribution Requirement" shall 65 report back to the Senate at the meeting of March 9th, 1983. 66 The Administrative Committee, in consultation with the Nominating 67 Committee, was requested to fill the two student vacancies at the 68 next meeting by presenting nominations. 69 Prof. Bennick next presented a proposal for a standard election 70 procedure for multiple candidates and multiple positions. 71 After discussion the proposal was withdrawn to be resubmitted as 72 needed. 73 Election of Membership-Panel and Chairperson-Panel for the Search 74 Committee for Dean of the School of Nursing 75 Prof. Bennick presented part A of the Report, which explained the 76 nominating and election process for search committees adopted by the 77 Senate on September 24th, 1980, as follows: 78 The three major sub-divisions of the School of Nursing (the R.N. 79 Pathway, the Generic Pathway, and the Masters Program), may nominate80 one or more full-time faculty members by election amongst its full- 81 time faculty members and one or more students by election amongst its student majors (or equivalent) for service on the search com-83 mittee. Faculty members--including part-time faculty--and student 84 majors from the School of Nursing may also be nominated by petition 85 of 25 faculty members and 25 students respectively. The Hunter 86 College Senate shall elect a panel of 8 faculty members and 6 87 student members from this pool of nominees in such a manner as to 88 provide for the widest possible distribution of sub-divisional 89 representation on the committee. From this panel the President 90 shall choose a search committee consisting of 4 faculty members 91 and 3 students. Sub-divisions not represented on the committee 92 shall be specifically invited to testify before the committee on 93 their concerns and recommendations. The Senate shall elect a panel 94 of 3 from amongst all <u>units of the College</u> other than the School 95 of Nursing from which the President shall choose a non-voting 96 Chairperson. The Chairperson shall serve as the executive officer 97 of the committee, sending out all correspondence, distributing 98 information on candidates, arranging interviews, etc. 99 As a result of its search procedure, the search committee 100 shall submit to the President a list containing the names of at 101 least 3 qualified candidates. The President shall either appoint 102 someone from this list or request that the committee reopen its 103 search to produce a new list. 104
